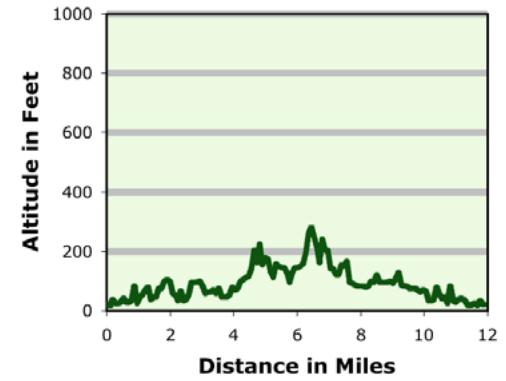


# Summerland Bicycle Ride



## Highlights of the Ride

- Dolphin Fountain.** This popular fountain was created by local artist Bud Bottoms in 1982 under sponsorship of the Santa Barbara/Puerto Vallarta Sister City Committee. A replica has been installed in Puerto Vallarta and elsewhere.
- Santa Barbara Biltmore Hotel.** Built in 1927, this elegant hotel uses Spanish elements throughout a series of buildings and cottages over the sprawling, lushly landscaped oceanfront land. One of the highest rated resorts in the country, it offers beach cruiser bicycles to its guests.
- Montecito Inn.** This hotel, a product of Hollywood's Golden Era, was built in 1928 by silent screen legend Charlie Chaplin as a haven for his friends.
- Ortega Hill bikepath.** This path was the result of strong advocacy by local bicyclists. It was a Caltrans project that gave cyclists an alternative to narrow, winding Ortega Hill Road. The path was constructed in conjunction with an acceleration lane project between Summerland and Montecito.
- Lookout Park.** This four-acre county park has splendid ocean views, grills, beach access, picnic tables, hiking trails, restrooms and a playground. The discovery of oil in 1894 led to onshore and the world's first ocean offshore wells near this park. At its peak in the 1920s, there were 12 piers stretching into the ocean dotted with oil derricks.
- Summerland.** This beachside community was founded in 1893 by Spiritualists, named "Summerland" which is their afterlife destination. The spiritual center of the town was a community séance room, demolished when Highway 101 was built. Today, you'll find restaurants and antique shops.
- Coast Village.** There are two shopping areas serving Montecito, and Coast Village Road is the "lower" one. The road was the Pacific Coast Highway before Highway 101 was constructed. Its width comes from those early 20th Century years, providing space for today's landscaped medians, parking and bikelanes.
- Andree Clark Bird Refuge.** Originally a tidal basin, this freshwater lagoon was created by closing off the connection to the ocean. It is a popular bird watching location with a nature trail along the north shore. Islands provide secure nesting space for birds free from humans and other predators.

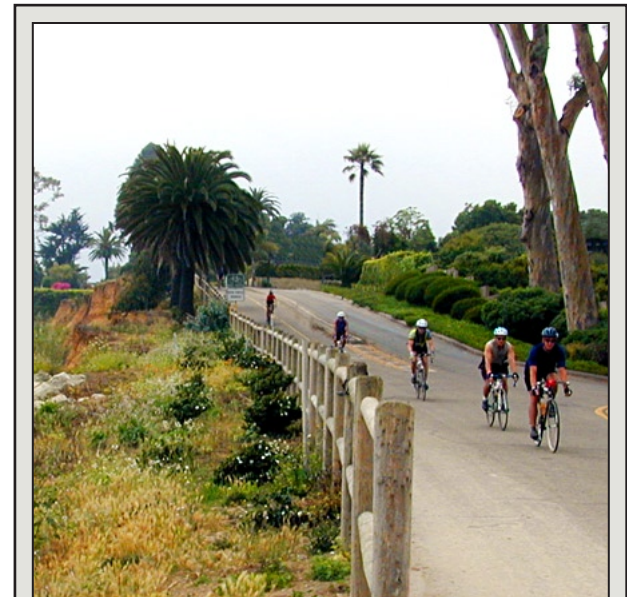
